Rediscovery Sale, Wednesday 21st August 2019



This week's Rediscovery sale coincided with the Bi-monthly Fine Art Sale, which always gives us a slightly different day and Monday's take-in had a bounty of the unusual and desirable: the above 'Howard Bros. Deytime Register' (sic), Victorian clocking-in clock is of a design one rarely sees, and is appealing on many levels, especially as it made £190. In the same 'Jules Verne' vein, we had a 'Professor Fuller's' cylinder calculator which sold for £130 ~ not as small as a smart phone, but probably as easier to use. Oriental offerings had a mixed lot with a jade trinket box for £240 and a small collection of ceramics including a blue & white ginger jar for £200 and a box lot with Eastern white metal pushed on to £170. A leather field-case with three spirit flasks made £75, time for the start of the cooler shoot days. Railwayana shone with a 3 aspect BR handlamp making £65 and £60 for an enamel warning sign. Some Royal Worcester was struggling, but not the Seabright signed plate at £140.
