Rediscovery Sale, Wednesday 28th August 2019



Due to the bank holiday it was a small sale this week but with a good average. Of the more noteworthy lots we can start with two cased Victorian sterling travelling communion sets from a retiring vicar (naturally) which made £220 each. We had a quantity of Masonic regalia, which when examined included 3 gold jewels and three gilt silver: the gold ones were making £250-270 each and £55 for the silver. Toys continue to be good - £95 for a small collection of mostly loose Dinkys including a few early examples, and £65 for three boxed 'N' gauge locos (and we already have more toys for next week). Pictures are often not as popular as in the past, but an appealing pair of Victorian oils of hunt scenes ran straight to £190. Of the furniture offerings the star was this 1970s Ladderax teak lounge unit; normally we don't even accept 'lounge units', but being box section steel and teak this had a good look to it and was perhaps more a modular storage unit, but in any case, it made £320. A grandmother clock in oak made £180 and £75 for a Titchmarsh & Goodwin corner unit.
