Rediscovery Sale, Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> September 2019



This week we saw a lot of militaria, much relating to one family who served in WWs 1&2, plus this wonderfully presented RAF album from the 1930s into WW2 which realised £250. A good WW1 bayonet made £48, and we had more unusual such as Lancaster Bomber instruments and even oversupply from HMS Ark Royal. Four oddments made from Zeppelin wire sold by the Red Cross to raise funds for the troops made £100 and a fun pair of early cast iron money boxes as sailors made £22. In a nice selection of model railway items there was a mixture of Hornby Dublo, including Mallard and Duchess class locos for £120, and three boxes of more recent OO gauge made £100. A cast bronze ram's head made £60 and pair of antique saddle racks made £80. Furniture was more plentiful this week, and the prices are very affordable: an oak monk's bench made its money at £160, but an Edwardian kneehole desk could be had for £95. Furnishing a house doesn't get more affordable than buying at auction.
